Financial Literacy & Stability

Financial Literacy and Stability are at the core of our mission to help people get on a path to thrive and achieve financial peace of mind. CommunityAmerica donated \$139,750 to ensure that youth and adults had opportunities to access needed support to stabilize their financial position through educational opportunities and training to foster understanding of how to maintain long-term financial stability.



Education

CommunityAmerica is dedicated to helping our Kansas City and St. Louis communities thrive, and we cannot do that without an educated workforce. In 2023, we donated \$182,093 in support of elementary, secondary and higher education, as well as workforce certification programs, reading literacy initiatives, and scholarships.



Health & Well-Being

The well-being of Kansas City depends on children and families having access to health care and programs focused on improving their health. CommunityAmerica donated more than \$224,975 in support of area hospitals, organizations focused on finding cures to complex diseases, and ensuring primary health and dental care for kids.



Strengthening Communities

The communities we are part of shape who we are. That is why we believe it is so important to support organizations that make our Kansas City and St. Louis regions better places to live and work. We invested more than \$1,126,237 to keep kids on track, help our arts community thrive, provide access to food and emergency services, and support efforts in our Community Access Center.

CommunityAmerica is founded on the principle of people helping people. We step up to support the people, events, and organizations that share our values and mean the most to our members. Here are a few highlights of our most notable commitments.

Kansas City Kansas Community College

In September 2023, CEO Lisa Ginter announced a **\$1 million** charitable gift designated for the new Kansas City Kansas Community Education, Health and Wellness Center in downtown Kansas City, Kansas (KCK). In partnership and collaboration with Kansas City Kansas Community College and Swope Health, the Center is purposefully designed to support the needs of people in downtown KCK and eastern Wyandotte County. This gift was in addition to our investments in the facility which will allow CommunityAmerica to provide banking services and financial well-being coaching, supporting our goal to grow and expand access to financial resources in our local communities.

Guadalupe Centers

Since 2017, we have helped expand Guadalupe's support for individuals and families in the Latino community throughout Kansas City. In addition to serving as the organization's presenting sponsor for fundraising events, we were proud to open a CommunityAmerica branch within its headquarters in December.

Founded in 1919, Guadalupe Centers' mission is to improve the lives of Latinos in the Kansas City region. According to the National Register of Historic Places, Guadalupe Centers remains the longest continuously operating organization serving Latinos in the United States.

This project was a great fit for CommunityAmerica and our mission to deliver financial peace of mind to all of Kansas City. Our collaboration with KCKCC and Swope Health will improve access to higher education, workforce development—and with our full commitment, access to a full suite of financial resources for local students and businesses alike.

The Vision for the Kansas City Kansas Community Education Center

University Health

CommunityAmerica was proud to serve as a presenting sponsor of University Health's "For the Love of KC" event along with University Health Physicians to ensure this healthcare resource continues to serve all Kansas Citians in need. CommunityAmerica CEO Lisa and her husband Barry Ginter joined Dr. Traci and Anthony Johnson as co-chairs of the event.

Founded in 1870 as Kansas City's first hospital, University Health provides world-class academic medical care to the community regardless of one's ability to pay. Serving more than 110,000 individuals from 13 Kansas City area counties, the hospital also has a respected Level 1 trauma center and is the preferred provider of Kansas City Police and Fire departments.

SevenDays®

CommunityAmerica CEO Lisa Ginter became the third recipient of Seven Day's Ripple of Kindness Award which recognizes a Kansas City leader who has gone above and beyond in demonstrating kindness through their actions and words. Seven Days cited Lisa's personal commitment to fostering a culture of kindness as a business and civic leader and through her volunteerism with the nonprofit community.

CommunityAmerica has supported SevenDays® since its inception in 2014, following a tragic hate crime in Overland Park, KS. SevenDays® overcomes hate by focusing on youth engagement to promote kindness and understanding through education and dialogue.

Big League Impact

In March, CommunityAmerica announced our expansion plans in St. Louis that included a unique partnership with the St. Louis Cardinals and famed pitching legend Adam Wainright.

In June, we teamed up with Adam to raise more than \$120,000 for his nonprofit, Big League Impact, as the presenting sponsor of the Swinging for Impact Topgolf Challenge. A few months later before a Cardinals game, CommunityAmerica presented a \$50,000 check to Adam's charity.

Founded by Adam Wainright in 2013, Big League Impact is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) that partners with professional athletes to raise money to support basic human needs including food, water, shelter, medical care and education. Its mission is to save lives, restore dignity and instill hope. CommunityAmerica's sponsorship will support Big League Impact efforts in the St. Louis community.

We have long admired the St. Louis region given our history in this market. We want St. Louisans to know they have a financial partner in their corner who is backed by more than 80 years of proven strength and stability—and is wholeheartedly dedicated to the financial well-being of people, businesses and our shared community.
